WELCOME, INTRODUCTIONS AND APPROVAL OF JUNE 2013 GLEC MEETING SUMMARY

The December 3rd to 4th, 2013 Great Lakes Executive Committee (GLEC) meeting was opened with welcome and introductory remarks from the GLEC Co-Chairs, Michael Goffin and Susan Hedman.

REPORT OUT ON THE GREAT LAKES PUBLIC FORUM AND GREAT LAKES SUMMIT

The GLEC Co-Chairs reported on both the Great Lakes Public Forum and the Great Lakes Summit, which took place in September 2013 [see presentations]. They also clarified the Great Lakes Water Quality Agreement (GLWQA) management cycle, the role and timing of the Forum and other related components within this management cycle.
